Flood Warnings (revised February 2024)

Flood warnings issued by the Environment Agency are usually too late, because they do not take account of the fact that our stretch of the Avon is backed up from the Severn at Tewkesbury.

Flood Levels

The best means of obtaining remotely the river levels on our stretch of the Avon

is a **River Level Station at Bredon** which can be found <https://check-for-flooding.service.gov.uk/station/2056> You will have to copy and paste this in your browser, and bookmark it. This also shows a graph.
